There has always been a need to devise a system for overaged children and based on this idea we started working with street children in 2007 to motivate them to go to school and change their life. Starting with only 35 children, with a small yet committed team, we were able to establish our first out of school children school inside the building of Federal Government Model School for Girls F-11/1.

Based on our experience, a training program was designed for those teachers who wanted to start and run a similar school. We have helped setup and maintain quality of more than ten schools all over Pakistan.

While growing bigger and learning every day, we started setting up new branches. We have spread our wings all over Islamabad. We currently have 16 schools in and around Islamabad. We plan to setup more schools every year In sha Allah. iFeel is a dream through which we see a 100% educated Islamabad with no child being out of school.

iFeel enjoys the support of many sponsors and well-wishers, many committed volunteers and hardworking staff member and last but no the least a very strong board of directors who give their time and energies to take iFeel to higher levels of excellence. Most of the schools are especially set up for over age children where accelerated primary programmes are offered. We also have a set of low cost private schools that are located in the outskirts of Islamabad where quality of education is hard to find.

Making our schools the basic unit of welfare work, we provide food and ration to needy families of students and also provide extra health to those who are orphans, so as to ensure that they do not drop out of school.

We also have skill development centers where students learned useful skills to ern money and make their life more effected. These skills are also aimed at providing students with a means of earning their lively hood.

Out of School Children's School (OSCS)

Out of School Children's Schools are special school for over age children offering accelerated primary programs of 2 to 3.5 years. Students of ages 7 and above a taken into this system and then mainstreamed after completing their primary and giving class 5 exam for Federal Directorate of Education.

OSCS F-11 Branch

- First branch, established in September 2009
- First class 5 batch graduated in 2012 (2.5 years)
- Some students from first batch now teaching in our schools
- Extracurricular activities include handicrafts, computers, stitching, aadaab classes and namaz
- Robotics program started in 2017
- Robotics team participated in First Lego League Championship in Lebanon in 2019 and won Judges award

















OSCS F-12 Mehrabadi

- Established in 2015
- Has a Science lab where students learn through practicals and demonstrations
- Regular Robotics classes are conducted for all classes
- Special Accelerated Primary Program (SAPP) for domestic workers and 12+ age groups conducted in afternoon
- Also used as centre for teachers' training
- 200+ students mainstreamed from this branch







OSCS Maira Akku Branch

- Established in 2019
- Land donated by a local
- Co education
- Extra focus on students, hygiene and grooming as branch is located in a slum area
- Staff tries to channelise students, energy positively through moral stories, namaz, ahadith and constant guidance

OSCS G-08 Branch

- Established in 2016
- One of the smaller branches with only 2 rooms
- Co education
- Mostly Christian students as located next to Christian colony
- Library corner set up in one room








OSCS G-06 Branch

- Established in 2015
- Co education
- Stitching centre started in 2019.
- 6 months stitching course offered
- Uniforms for OSCS students stitched in centre
- Stitching students also learn Tajweed, embroidery and recycling of old materials
- Special Accelerated Primary Program (SAPP) started for stitching students in May 2023











OSCS I-9 Branch

- Established in 2015
- Initially started in a house in one of the two katchi abadis in the area
- Females who were not allowed to go outside their houses were enrolled after staff visited the area and persuaded their families
- These females were facilitated to complete their matriculation
- Now branch based in proper school building
- Many students work in Mangal bazaar to support their family and are given half day off on Tuesdays in order to retain them
- More than 420 students have studied in this branch







OSCS G-14 Branch

- Established in 2011 in Quran Ghar (a centre imparting Quran education)
- Most students are Afghan refugees
- 1000+ students have studied from this branch
- Teachers attend daily Quran class in centre before school starts
- 100+ enrolment at one time
- Special Accelerated Primary Program (SAPP) started in 2022 to cater to young Afghan girls

OSCS I-8 Branch

- Established in 2015
- Co education
- 5 batches of class 5 have graduated
- More than 500 students have studied in this branch
- Also used as centre for teacher's 'training
- One of the bigger branches with 5 rooms and 100+ enrolment at a time















OSCS D-14 Branch

- Established in 2016
- Co education
- School building custom built and rented on nominal amount by a supporter
- Building also houses a stitching centre and medical centre
- Playgroup started to retain students as many of them have younger siblings who cannot be left home alone because mothers go out for work
- 100+ enrolment at a time



OSCS I-10/4 Branch

- Established 2015
- Smallest branch with only one room
- Two classes sit side by side
- 50 students have graduated from class 5 since 2015
- Very dedicated teachers who work hard to deliver quality education to students in tough circumstances



OSCS E-11 Branch

- Established in 2015
- Evening branch for both boys and girls
- Mostly caters to students who missed school because they had to look after their siblings while their mothers went for work in the morning
- Located near katchi Abadi in Golra Sharif

OSCS Narail Branch

- Established in 2018
- Joint Venture with Azmat Foundation
- Small branch with dedicated staff
- Stitching is also taught to female students





□ Friends OSCS Westridge Branch

- Established in 2022
- Joint venture with Friends Welfare Trust (FWT) and housed in basement of hospital's building.
- 3 small rooms with 40+ enrolment













OSCS E-9 Branch

- Established in 2022
- Evening branch
- Caters mostly to students belonging to low income families in Navy whose education is disrupted and affected due to transfers
- Offers Special Accelerated Primary Program (SAPP) only

iFeel Community Model School

iFeel Community Model Schools are located in outskirts of Islamabad where high quality primary and secondary education is provided at very low costs. People living in the areas where these school are located belong to marginalized strata of our society and are in desperate need for this facility.

Ifeel Community Model School Tarnol

Tarnol branch is located in Syndmar Tarnol Islamabad. The school was established in 2012. Currently the total strength of the students is 295. Till date 87 students have been mainstreamed to higher classes in regular schools. There is a playground with swings and a garden inside the school. A computer, library, sound system are available to enhance the learning of students. Branch location being far from the city, facilities like photo copying are provided at the school. A Tafseer class for staff is conducted regularly and Tajweed (Quran recitation) is taught to students daily. Every Ramadhan, Dora e Quran is conducted for the local ladies most of whom are mother of our students. Ration is also distributed to most needy families who attend this program.



Ifeel Community Model School Ghora Mast

This school is located in a hilly yet lush green area next to the river Suan. A Popular historical place called Oilla Pharwala can be visited from here. A team of committed teachers and staff serves this school. They worked without salary for over a year when the previous organization left and pulled out it's funding.

iFeel adopted the school in year 2022 and initiated construction of a science laboratory on a special request by the students as only arts subjects were offered.



□ Ifeel Community Model School Dhallah

This school is located in a very beautiful area surrounded by lush green fields and mountains. It is 25 minutes drive from Nilor and close to Simli Dam right next to river Suwan.

The building was constructed in 2007 and earlier it was run by local community. Due to lack of funds the school was near closure when iFeel decided to adopt it in February 2023. This school is one of the only two options for the children of three adjacent villages to get primary and secondary education.

The 1st batch of matric passed out in 2015. Since the people of this area could not afford education the fee structure was kept very low and orphan children from needy families were given free education. Children passing out from this school are not settled and doing jobs in various professions.

Currently there are 240 students from playgroup to matric studying in iFeel Community Model School Dallah. Computer training is also part of the curriculum. In addition to high quality education, students are given equal opportunities for extra curriculum

iFeel for Orphans

Monthly support through free education and providing monthly ration for the families who are raising them. This ensures that the orphans are not pulled out of school as soon as their mother or father passes away. An undertaking is given by their families that they will continue to send those kids to school so they can be eligible for the monthly ration to help feed the orphan child under their supervision.

iFeel for Health

Most of the family member of our students cannot afford medical expenses when need arises hence iFeel for Health program helps our most deserving students in getting their medical expenses covered through various means.





Hunermand

At iFeel we realize the importance of skill development and due to this reason, we keep trying to make our students equipped with necessary skills so that they can earn an honest living. Hunermand program provides need-based skill development courses and helps find them

means of livelyhood for those who complete courses. Currently our G-6 branch hosts a stitching center under this program and we pay the students for each uniform that they stich. This uniform is needed at our branches and so our students passing out from this program have a regular income. Previously Electrical courses were offered to male students of F-12 branch. In future we plan to offer similar courses in other branches at different locations of Islamabad in sha Allah. Cooking courses have also been arranged for students of I-9 branch where they learnt how to prepare and pack frozen precooked foods. Many of these students have set up small businesses at home and are using that skill to earn their living.

A certified teachers training program and street children school development program is also under consideration so that masses can be equipped with the basic knowledge required to establish and operate all across the country. We hope and pray that our sponsors and donors continue to extend the same support they have given us all these years. We also hope that we can increase our donors and sponsors network so that our future goals can be accomplished.
